A Special Message from the Galliara family

The Galliara family, who have lived in Stanmore for the last forty years are making a regular donation to Whitchurch Primary School in memory of Jayant Shashikant Galliara. Jay was born and grew up in India before coming over to the UK for higher education and settling here for work. He married and brought up three daughters in the local area, who all attended local schools. Access to a good education and opportunities for young people was highly important to him and he was previously engaged with local schools to support children, particularly those from a disadvantaged background. He passed away in 2022 from pancreatic cancer, but it was his express wish to set up a fund to support children from disadvantaged backgrounds to be able to attend school visits.

As such, a fund has been set up with an annual sum being provided to Whitchurch for £750 per year over the next ten years to fulfil his wishes. These funds are to support children who may otherwise not have been able to attend school trips and visits due to a lack of funds. The family would like to thank the team at Whitchurch Primary School for making this possible and would very much like to hear from children and families who will be benefitting from this and learning how this has made a positive impact for the children who have been supported through this scheme.

Friday 6 October is World Smile Day. The day was created by Harvey Ball who developed the iconic yellow smiley image. He believed that you could improve the world one smile at a time.

Research shows that children smile an average of 400 times per day, compared to the typical adult who only smiles only 20 times per day.

Why is smiling important?

Smiling not only offers a mood boost but helps our bodies release endorphins that provide numerous health benefits, including reduced blood pressure, increased endurance, reduced pain and reduced stress.

To keep that smile looking great:

- Brush twice a day
- Use a fluoride toothpaste
- Brush for 2 minutes




Year 5


Air Resistance

Schools Counselling Partnership: Developing Friendship Skills



School is the place where children learn to navigate the world of friendships. At this age, alliances often shift and change. Learning to make friends and get along with peers can cause some distress to most children.

How can parents help? - It is important to listen to your child's experiences with peer challenges. Instead of telling them what to do, help them problem-solve, and also to clarify and understand their feelings. It is always best to stay away from taking sides with either child- offer empathy for all of your child's feelings, and also reflect together on how their peer might be feeling. Coach your child to stand up for themselves using their words and help them learn to express their needs rather than attacking their friend. It is helpful to practice this together!



Book Recommendations


'We Sang Across the Sea' by Benjamin Zephaniah
