Reading for Pleasure

We have sent out suggested reading lists for children this week. With so many interesting and diverse books, these lists should appeal to all children, irrespective of their current reading level.

It's also worth remembering the significance of reading for pleasure and the immense effect books can have on our children's education.

Here are some helpful tips on how to make reading time associated with enjoyment:

- 1. Allow your child to express their preferences and if possible to select the reading material. Influence and model their choice, but never force yours.
- 2. Make reading a consistent activity each day even for a few minutes. Let your children see you reading a book, combine listening and reading aloud and bring characters to life by adopting all the silly voices children will love to share this experience with you! Remember that bedtime reading is a perfect way to end the day.
- 3. Get comfortable and snuggle up in your favourite place with the book. The quieter and more isolated it feels from the rest of the house the deeper you fall into the story.
- 4. Talk about the story and ask questions. Make sure your children understand any unfamiliar words and are able to follow the basic storyline.
- 5. Re-read all the favourites. Repetition and rhyme plays a huge role in acquiring reading skills.
- 6. Visit your local library. These places are brimming with the latest reads and regularly offer fun activities for the whole family perfect for cold, rainy weather.
- 7. Most of all, enjoy these shared moments of closeness and togetherness. Above all, you're creating memories for lifetime!

A really helpful parenting tool...

Parenting can feel so hard. There will be moments when your buttons are pushed and you feel stressed, overloaded, and exhausted, maybe now more so than ever. However, there is a tool that can help you get through those difficult moments and that can keep you from saying things that you will feel sorry about later.

What can parents and carers do?

Use your PAUSE button. Whenever you start to feel angry or irritated with your child's behaviour, stop what you are doing and take three deep breaths - or as many as you need! Take a moment to use an image or a thought that will help you to feel calmer. Remind yourself that this is not an emergency and think of something you really love about your child. Once you feel calmer, you will be able to choose a response based on connection, rather than react in anger or worry. It takes some practice, but it does get easier!
