Year Group Highlights

The Three Little Pigs

This week in Nursery, we have explored 'The Three Little Pigs'. We loved role playing the characters and enjoyed making houses for the three little pigs using straw, sticks and bricks. Meanwhile in Maths we explored 2D Shapes including circles, triangles, squares and rectangles.

This week in PSHE, Year 1 have been looking at similarities and differences between us and our friends. We worked together to figure out what was the same and what was different about us.






Fireworks

This week in Maths, Year 2 have been learning how to use empty number lines as a strategy to help us add together two 2-digit numbers. We started with the first number and added on the second number by partitioning it into tens and units.

Whitchurch Primary School and Murs

Forces - Friction

This week in Science, Year 3 explored the force of friction. We conducted an investigation to find out which surface material would create the most friction when rolling a toy car down a ramp. In order to do this we measured how high the ramp needs to be for the car to move.


A Christmas Carol - Scrooge

In English this week, Year 4 have been exploring the main character Scrooge from the novel 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens. We created a soul chain by writing down bad deeds we imagine he has done and linking these together.



Forces - Levers

In Science, pupils have been learning about forces, including levers. We used our understanding of fulcrum, load and effort to explore how to balance a 500g weight with a 200g weight. We discovered that the smaller weight would have to be further from the 'fulcrum' (or centre) of the balance (see-saw).



Physical and Human Features

This week in Geography, Year 6 have been learning about the physical and human features in different parts of the world. We enjoyed working together to create maps showing the biomes in an area (including desert, grassland, forest and marine regions).








Book Recommendations: Non-Fiction November

They are perfect for those children who are yet to embrace longer chapter books and allow reader do dip in and out, gradually building their reading stamina and confidence.



'Counting on Katherine: How Katherine Johnson Put Astronauts on the Moon' by Helaine Becker

Meet Katherine Johnson, the mathematical genius who helped make the historic Apollo 11 moon landings possible and made sure that Apollo 13 returned home safely when the mission was in critical danger. Counting on Katherine is a beautiful illustrated biography, sure to inspire young readers.

'The First World War, Usborne History of Britain' by Henry Brook, Tom Lalonde and Stephen Moncrieff

From the terror of the trenches to the beaches of Gallipoli this book tells the story of Britain during the first war ever to touch all corners of the globe.

Follow events on battlefield around the world, and see how they affected peoples' lives at home, as the British and their allies faced one of the most destructive wars in history. Suitable for junior children.

Play - the greatest gift of all!

All children need to play. It is their way of learning skills and helps them to release their emotions. Regularly playing with your child will help you to feel closer. It will also encourage them to cooperate more and you will feel more energised!

What can parents and carers do?

Most of you might feel exhausted at the end of the day, with the demands of everyday life. However, all you need is 10 mins of play, which will help both you and your child to let out some of the stress accumulated from your day. Can you try any of these at some point in your day?

- If your child is feeling over-excited and needs to let off some energy, take them to a quiet, safe space and letting them spin around while you watch them.
- If your child needs some help calming down, perhaps you could blow bubbles together and see how long you can keep them in the air before popping.
- Play football together by blowing a cotton ball around through straws.
- If your child is finding a situation difficult, use stuffed toy animals to act it out.
- Finally, always follow your child's lead and join them in their favourite game: let them teach you how to play!

Life Skills Group - Money Twister


