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

Nursery Rhymes






Diwali




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Classification

'The Good Turn' by Sharna Jackson



Help your child to feel heard

Children are more likely to follow our rules when they feel we are listening to them. Everyday routines can get in the way, however taking a moment to listen to your child will really model how they respond and react to you. Sometimes its good to think what it is like when us as adults are not heard or listened to, how does that make you feel? This might be how your child feels.



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How can you help as parents and carers? Acknowledge what your child is asking for, even if your answer is 'no'. For example: "I hear you. You are saying it loud and clear - NO BATH! You really do not want to have a bath! Tonight though, you do need to have one... so which do you choose - a bath or a shower?" Offering a choice to your child can be really powerful because they feel they have some control, even if it's small.

National Dental Epidemiology Programme (NDEP)

All they require is 2-3 hours during a school day to perform a quick dental check of a small sample of pupils aged 5 from our Reception and Year 1 classes - our designated population for this school year's programme.
