### Literacy

- To use their name card and attempt to write the letters becoming more confident accurate in the forming the letters correctly
- To enjoy counting, tapping, blending, or segmenting a word into syllables.
- To remember the rhyming words to familiar stories and rhymes.
- To have a developing phonological awareness, matching words with the same initial sound
- To recognise their name
- Story sequencing, putting events in order

### **Supporting children at home:**

- Read every day with your child introducing new stories and revisiting favourite stories
- Notice print in the environment

## **Communication and Language**

- To pay attention and complete a 'guided' activity with an adult
- To be introduced to new words and use them in their play and within the correct contexts
- To use longer sentences
- To be able to use words to solve disagreements

### **Supporting children at home:**

- Talk to your child about what they have done and the things you notice around you
- Do a short activity together e.g. play a game

# **Understanding the World**

#### **Past and Present**

- To take an interest in plants growing outside and to grow a plant
- Develop concept of before, after and next

### **People, Culture and Communities**

- To develop understanding of different jobs people do e.g. Zzokeeper, farmer
- To widen knowledge of religious celebrations and how people celebrate
- Understand that some places are special to members of their communites

#### The Natural World

- Understand life cycles of animals and plants
- To respect and care for minibeasts
- Learn facts about minibeasts
- To describe how minibeasts move, what they look like and how they feel

- Notice different insects out and about

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- To play within a group
- To be able to take turns
- To be happy to take part in shared learning opportunities with key adults.

### Supporting children at home:

- To label your child's emotions and respond in a supportive way
- Arrange a playdate at home or at the playground

### **Expressive Arts and Design**

- To explore materials freely and create observational drawings
- To sing familiar songs
- To play instruments to express ideas and feelings

### Supporting children at home:

• Sing, pretend and make things together

### **Physical Education**

- To manipulate clay/playdough/plasticine (rolls balls, makes snakes, cookies)
- To begin to use anticlockwise movements and retrace vertical lines (letter wrting)
- To imitate simple bilateral movements of limbs (e.g. arms up together)
- To use climbing equipment with confidence
- To catch a ball being bounced
- Practise team games for sports day

#### **Supporting children at home:**

- Fine motor development give children opportunities to use scissors at home
- Practise name writing at home
- Go and climb in the park!
